## **EERIE HORROR FEST**

The Eerie Horror Fest is four days of selected short and feature-length films, celebrity meet-and-greets, cast and crew Q&As, panel discussions, a vendor hall, and receptions, all in the beautiful historic Warner Theatre in Erie, Pennsylvania.

The Eerie Horror Fest returned after a 5-year hiatus October 28-30, 2021 with headline guests Michael Biehn (Aliens, Terminator), David Naughton (An American Werewolf in London), and the cast of Unearth (Marc Blucas, Alison McAtee, and PJ Marshall).

October 5-8, 2022, the fest had a record attendance of 1,500 to see four nights of special events. The headline event was the silent film Nosferatu with a live performance of the Warner Theatre's pipe organ. Other headline guests included Tobey Poser and John Adams (The Adams Family) screening Hellbender, the cast and director of Children of the Corn doing live commentary during their screening, and Actor Mark Patton and Filmmaker Carter Smith participating in a live panel to discuss queer themes in horror after screenings of Bugcrush and Swallowed.

Unique to our event is the Pitch Competition. We accept ideas in the form of the first 5-pages of a script and a pitch deck, and finalists are invited to pitch, in person, to a panel of film industry judges. In 2022, Braden McClain and his winning pitch for "Rusalka" will receive a consultation and the potential to be taken on as a project by Blood Oath (jointhebloodoath.com).

Eerie Horror Fest 2023 is accepting submissions on FilmFreeway.com from December 1-July 1, 2023. The festival is October 4-7 at the Warner Theatre in Erie, PA.
